## **SHOW TEASER (1:10)**

It's really funny to me how a person can be a Christian for fifty years, yet not understand one thing about the Lord Jesus Christ, nor one thing about what it really means to be a Christian. In fact, that was my experience until I started studying Paul's Letter to the Romans in the New Testament. Most of the time I have spent studying Romans, I've spent in complete shock...in shock about how ignorant I was about what the Lord Jesus Christ is doing with His creatures...in shock about how clear the Lord is...in shock about how simple His ways are...and in shock about how easy the Lord is to understand. You've probably heard someone say, "The Lord works in mysterious ways!" No. He doesn't work in mysterious ways. The Lord works in easy to understand and very predictable ways. So don't settle for that lie. I hope to do the Lord's Word some justice as I pass along His messages to you in this series of lessons on Paul's letter to the Romans.

#### THE INVITATION (2:40)

# TODAY'S LESSON Paul Has Good News for You

In our last lesson, we studied Romans, Chapter 1, Verses 1 to 7. In those verses, we introduced Paul's letter to the believers at first century Rome, but we also introduced the idea that God has Good News for You. The good news is a gospel message that details how you can be saved. What is the gospel message?

THE GOSPEL is the good news concerning the sacrifice the Lord Jesus Christ made at the Cross for all of His creatures, providing a way for them to be saved. Three verses capture the essence of the gospel message. Acts, Chapter 16, Verse 31...

Acts 16:31

"Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and everyone in your household who also believes."

John, Chapter 14, Verse 6...

#### John 14:6

Jesus said to doubting Thomas, "I am the way, and the truth, and the eternal life; no one comes to God the Father but through believing in Me.

John, Chapter 3, Verses 36...the Lord Jesus Christ says...

#### John 3:36

"He who believes in the Son has eternal life; but he who does not obey the (command to believe in the) Son will not see (eternal) life, but instead the wrath of God the Father (the Lake of Fire) abides on him."

Perhaps a story from the book of Luke would illustrate better the Good News concerning God's attitude toward you. Luke, Chapter 15, beginning at Verse 1...

#### Luke 15:1

Now all the tax collectors and the sinners (prostitutes) were coming near Jesus to listen to Him.

#### Luke 15:2

Both the Pharisees and the scribes began to grumble, saying, "This man receives sinners (prostitutes) and eats with them."

#### Luke 15:3

So Jesus told them this parable, saying...

#### Luke 15:4

"What man among you, if he has a hundred sheep and has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open pasture and go after the one which is lost until he finds it?"

#### Luke 15:5

"When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing."

#### Luke 15:6

"And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!"

## Luke 15:7

"I tell you that in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents (who changes his mind about having a relationship with Christ) than over ninety-nine righteous persons (believers in Christ) who need no repentance."

That's what I love about my God, the Lord Jesus Christ. He walks His talk. He didn't hang out with the "beautiful people." He hung out with the people who were considered by the "beautiful people" to be the most despicable people in Jewish society at the time...prostitutes and tax collectors...those who were lost. You see, the Lord Jesus Christ is always looking for the ones who are lost. That's really good news for you, especially if you are lost. Especially if you are an unbleiver.

But there's more good news. Paul has Good News for You, too. Paul not only has the good news of the gospel message. Paul has good news in the matter of your imperfection. Are you imperfect? What is God's attitude toward imperfect creatures?

If you are a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, and I asked you, "Are you a sinner?" ... you'd probably say, "Yes." You think of yourself as a sinner because you commit personal sins. Well if you are a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, you're no longer a sinner. Sorry to disappoint you. You're not a sinner as a believer in Christ. You're a saint. The term "sinner" is always a reference to a person who does not have a relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. It is never a reference to those who are believers in Christ. For example, Romans, Chapter 5, Verse 8 says...

#### Romans 5:8

But God the Father demonstrates His own unconditional love toward all mankind, in that while we were yet sinners (while we were ungodly, unrighteous, unbelievers), Christ died for us.

Romans, Chapter 1, Verse 7 makes it clear that all believers in Christ are saints by the invitation of God...by the calling of God...

Romans 1:7

...and this letter is written to all of you who are the beloved...the divinely loved ones of God the Father...you believers in Christ living in Rome, saints by the calling of God, as holy and set apart ones: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

So God's attitude toward you believers in Christ...even though you still commit personal sins...even though you are quite imperfect...is that He sees you believers in Christ as saints. First John, Chapter 2, Verses 1 and 2 say...

## First John 2:1

My little children, I (John) am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, and all believers do, we have an Advocate with God the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous...

## First John 2:2

...and the Lord Jesus Christ Himself is the propitiation for our sins; and not for our sins as believers in Christ only, but also for those sins of the whole world (unbelievers as well).

Propitiation. That means that the work of the Lord Jesus Christ on the Cross, shedding His blood for us, is the ONLY perfectly satisfactory payment for your sins in the eyes of God the Father. You cannot save yourself. You cannot purge your sins yourself.

Whether you are a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, or an unbeliever, God has Good News for You and Paul has Good News for you, too. Paul describes himself, and accurately so, as the worst person of all time. Isn't it great that the Lord Jesus Christ selected one of his greatest enemies to preach the Good News of the Gospel Message to the Gentiles? Since you will never be as bad as Paul, that's good news for you, too.

That's what I find so amazing about my God. If you are atheist...if you don't believe there is a God...God loves you unconditionally. I wouldn't do that! If you are agnostic...if you don't believe God or His truths can be known...God loves you unconditionally. If you are religious, over focused on your sins and your works...God loves you unconditionally. If you are legalistic, over focused on the law...God loves you unconditionally. If you're a tax collector...God loves you unconditionally. If you're a prostitute...God loves you unconditionally. If you're a drug addict...an alcoholic...a Pastor...we have to include ourselves among the most

despicable because God always puts the most despicable people up front... God loves you unconditionally. No matter who you are...no matter what your previous condition of servitude...God loves you unconditionally. We have an amazing God on our hands.

Today we'll be studying Romans, Chapter 1, Verses 8 to 15, which reads this way...and remember, Paul is talking to the saints, the believers in Christ at Rome, in the first century...

#### Romans 1:8

First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, because your faith is being proclaimed throughout the whole world.

#### Romans 1:9

For God, whom I serve in my spirit in the preaching of the gospel of His Son, is my witness as to how unceasingly I make mention of you...

#### Romans 1:10

...always in my prayers making request, if perhaps now at last by the will of God I may succeed in coming to you.

#### Romans 1:11

For I long to see you so that I may impart some spiritual gift to you, that you may be established...

#### Romans 1:12

...that is, that I may be encouraged together with you while among you, each of us by the other's faith, both yours and mine.

#### Romans 1:13

I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that often I have planned to come to you (and have been prevented so far) so that I may obtain some fruit among you also, even as among the rest of the Gentiles.

## Romans 1:14

I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish.

#### Romans 1:15

So, for my part, I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome.

The focus of this second section of the first chapter of Paul's letter to the Romans is really Paul communicating his feelings of affection for the saints at Rome. And since the attention of this part of the first chapter turns to Paul, I think it is important for you to know who Paul is. Here is Paul describing himself in First Corinthians, Chapter 15, Verses 1 to 10...

#### First Corinthians 15:1

Now I (Paul) make known to you, brethren (believers in Christ), the gospel (message) which I preached to you, which also you received (you believed in), in which (gospel message) also you stand...

#### First Corinthians 15:2

...by which (gospel message) also you are saved, if you hold fast the word which I preached to you, unless you believed in vain.

#### First Corinthians 15:3

For I (Paul) delivered to you as of first importance what (gospel message) I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures...

#### First Corinthians 15:4

...and that He was buried, and that He was raised (that is resurrected from the dead) on the third day according to the Scriptures...

## First Corinthians 15:5

...and that He appeared to Cephas (the apostle Peter), then to the twelve (the apostles minus Judas Iscariot).

#### First Corinthians 15:6

After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren (believers in Christ) at one time, most of whom remain (physically alive) until now, but some have fallen asleep (some have died physically)...

#### First Corinthians 15:7

...then He appeared to James (His half brother), then to all the apostles (that is, all who had the spiritual gift of apostle)...

#### First Corinthians 15:8

...and last of all, as to one untimely born, the Lord Jesus Christ appeared to me also.

#### First Corinthians 15:9

For I (Paul) am the least of the apostles, and I am not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.

#### First Corinthians 15:10

But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me did not prove vain; but I labored even more than all of them, yet not I, but the grace of God with me.

Paul accurately described Himself as the worst person of all time. As the most imperfect human being ever, Paul was sent to us by God to preach the most important message ever...the GOSPEL MESSAGE...a message about what God was willing to do for imperfect and fallen creatures. God chose His greatest enemy, Paul, to become His greatest apostle and His greatest messenger. What a phenomenal attitude our God has toward the weak! He showed us, through His selection of Paul, what He is willing to do with each of His imperfect creatures if we let Him. God has a perfect plan for your imperfect life. You may not see it...you may see it and not understand it...but God has a plan for you...a real...deep...intimate...and personal plan for His relationship with you.

Now let's look at Romans, Chapter 1, Verses 8 to 15 in detail...

#### Romans 1:8

First, I (Paul) thank my God the Father in prayer through Jesus Christ's name for all of you believers in Rome, because your faith is being proclaimed throughout the whole world, which is the entire Roman Empire.

In spite of the persecution of the government in the first century against Christians, persecution that included throwing Christians to the lions in the Roman Coliseum and letting people see them being ripped to shreds by lions...the GOSPEL MESSAGE was being spread by these brave Christians through the whole world. I'll tell you what...if you were a Christian, there were two places you did not want to be in the first century...Rome and Jerusalem. Few good things happened for Christians in those two cities!

Romans 1:9

For God the Father, whom I Paul serve in my human spirit by the preaching of the gospel of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, is my witness, as to how unceasingly I make mention of you believers in Rome...in intercessory prayer...

Paul was always praying for the persecuted brethren at Rome...

#### Romans 1:10

...I am always in my prayers making requests for you, even making petitions for myself as well, if perhaps now, at last, by the will of God I may succeed in coming to you.

Paul, in spite of the dangers, wanted to visit Rome to be with the believers there. What was he, NUTS? Probably. Or maybe he just had faith in Christ!

#### Romans 1:11

For I, Paul, long to see you believers in Rome so that I may impart some spiritual gift to you, that you may be established...

#### Romans 1:12

...that is, that I, Paul, may be encouraged together with you while among you, each of us being encouraged by the other's faith, both your faith encouraging me and my faith encouraging you.

He wanted to be with them to encourage them face-to-face...and he wanted to be encouraged by them as well.

#### Romans 1:13

I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, you believers in Rome, that often I have planned to come to you and have been prevented by God so far...I want to come so that I may obtain some fruit among you also, even as I obtain fruit among the rest of the Gentiles.

God was brilliant not to let Paul go to Rome. It kept him alive!

#### Romans 1:14

I am under obligation both to people who speak Greek and to barbarians, people who don't speak Greek, both to the wise, who are believers in Christ, and to the foolish, who are unbelievers.

People who didn't speak Greek were called barbarians because the joke was that when they talked, the sounded like this to Greek speakers...bar..

#### Romans 1:15

So, for my part, I am eager to preach the gospel, as a minster, to you also who are in Rome.

Paul wanted to be with the Roman believers. And when he was there, of course, he would engage in his passion and in his calling...the spreading of the Good News of the Gospel Message.

Here's a song written and sung by the Barah Ministries Song Worship Leader, June Murphy. It is the gospel message. A song called "Whosoever."

WHOSOEVER June Murphy 5:09

God Has Good News For You...the gospel message tells you how to be saved...Acts, Chapter 16, Verse 31...

#### Acts 16:31

"Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and everyone in your household who also believes."

Paul Has Good News for You...you don't have to be perfect to be saved...in Colossians, Chapter 1, Verses 25 to 27 we learn that the worst sinner of all time, Paul, had one of the most important jobs in divine history...

#### Colossians 1:25

Of this church I (Paul) was made a minister by God according to the stewardship from God the Father bestowed on me for your benefit, so that I might fully carry out the preaching of the Word of God...

Colossians 1:26

...that is, the preaching about the mystery which has been hidden from the past ages and generations, but has now been manifested (made clearly visible) to His saints (all believers in Christ)...

#### Colossians 1:27

...to whom God the Father willed to make known what is the glorious riches of this mystery I'm talking about among the Gentiles, the mystery of Christ indwelling all of you believers, the hope (the absolute confidence) of (your future) glory.

Ephesians, Chapter 3, Verses 8 to 10 describes Paul's ministry this way...

## Ephesians 3:8

To me, the very least of all saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unfathomable riches of Christ...

## Ephesians 3:9

...and to bring to light what is the dispensation of the mystery (the Church Age) which for ages has been hidden in THE God who created the all things (the Lord Jesus Christ)...

## Ephesians 3:10

...so that the manifold wisdom of God the Father might now be made known through the church to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenly places.

Paul has a life ministry...you have a life ministry. Do you know what your ministry is?

The good news for you is that if you're a tax collector or a prostitute or any other despicable person, that "God Cares for You." He is looking for you if you are lost, and He will find you, so that if you want to, you can be saved. He'll make clear to you what He wants you to do with your life. And don't worry...your will is factored in...he wants you to do what you want to do.

This radio show is an invitation for you to join us for biblical study if you want to get to know God and His Word. Our aim at Barah Ministries is to represent accurately the Person, the thinking, the work, the reputation and the essence of the Supreme Being of the Universe, the Lord and Savior Jesus
